- (4) whose hearts are set on the <u>pilgrims'</u> way. **R.**
- (1) Those who go through the desolate valley will find it a place of springs,
- (2) for the early rains have covered it with pools of water.
- (1) They will climb from strength to strength;
- (2) The God of gods will be seen <u>in</u> Zion.
- (3) O God of hosts, hear my prayer;
- (4) hearken, O God of Jacob. R.

- (1) Behold our defender, O God;
- (2) and look upon the face of your <u>a</u>nointed.
- (3) For one day in your courts is better than a thousand in my <u>own</u> room,
- (3) and to stand at the threshold of the house of \underline{my} God
- (4) than to dwell in the tents of the wicked. R.
- (1) You, God, are both sun <u>and</u> shield,
- (2) you will give grace and glory.
- (1) No good thing will you withhold
- (2) from those who walk with \underline{in} tegrity.
- (3) O God of hosts,
- (4) happy are they who put their <u>trust</u> in you! **R.**
